<u>Sunday 4th May</u> will be a work party at Moorsholm. <u>Please, please, please</u> try and attend - no major work just a "keep it tidy" and maintenance day. Don't forget Moorsholm is our lifeline and a fantastic asset to our club. How many other clubs offer such a venue enabling you to shoot 365 days of the year. But it needs looking after.

When using Moorsholm DO NOT attach any targets directly to the sleepers / backstop etc. USE THE TARGET STAKES ONLY. DO NOT shoot any of the steels with jacketed ammunition or they will be locked away to stop any more breakages.

Our club is famous for its Safety Record. When you attend Moorsholm without a committee member present one person must be responsible for range safety, usually the person on the right hand side - make sure no one goes forward without first declaring "range clear". Make sure you have not left any live rounds behind etc. Sweep up any empty cases and throw any combustible material onto the bonfire. Take anything else away with you when you leave. Remember to keep it tidy. Leave it as you wish to find it. We are always grateful for any target cardboard and especially target stakes. If you have any please leave it in the bottom target shed.

Enclosed with this Bulletin you will find your 2014 membership cards (if you did not attend the AGM). Probationary members will receive theirs at completion of the probationary period. Please attach a current passport sized photograph and carry it with you when attending the ranges - you may be asked to produce it.

PRESIDENTS CUP 2014

12/13 April A competition open to all members, has been arranged for the above trophy to take place at NRA Bisley ranges. Shooting as follows:

Practice Saturday afternoon 12 April Stickledown 1000yds

Competition Sunday morning 13 April Stickledown 1000yds

The competition winner will be judged on the best string of 10 shots fired at 1000yds. A string will consist of 2 Sighters, followed by 10 shots. Sighters may be converted. However, they must be converted before continuing. In the event of a draw the highest number of V Bulls will be the winner. A range fee of £10.00 per session will be made to offset NRA range fees.

THIEPVAL TROPHY 2014

<u>12 April</u> This is a competition which is open to **all members**. It has been arranged for the above trophy to take place at NRA Bisley ranges. The competition is for "as issued" military rifles of any age or calibre or country, with ammunition "in the spirit of the original". <u>Shooting as follows:</u>

Saturday morning Century Range 600 yards

There will be prizes for 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , 3^{rd} , places the competitor who has the highest score will be deemed the winner. In the event of a tie, the highest number of V Bulls will be the winner. The competition will be judged on the best string of 10 shots fired. A string will consist of 2 Sighters, followed by 10 shots. Sighters may be converted; however, they must be converted before continuing. A range fee of £10.00 per session will be made to offset NRA range fees.

METCALFE AGGREGATE CUP 2014

30/31 August A competition open to all members, has been arranged for the above trophy to take place at NRA Bisley ranges. Shooting as follows:

There is a first place prize for each of the three distances however; the Metcalfe Cup winner will be the competitor who has the highest aggregate score over the three distances. In the event of a tie, the shooter with the highest number of V Bulls will be the winner. The competition will be judged on the best string of 10 shots fired. A string will consist of 2 Sighters, followed by 10 shots. Sighters may be converted; however, they must be converted before continuing. There will be second and third place prizes for the Metcalfe Cup. A range fee of £10.00 per session will be made to offset NRA range fees.
